Notice of Privacy Practices

THIS NOTICE DESCRIBES HOW MEDICAL INFORMATION ABOUT YOU MAY BE USED AND DISCLOSED AND HOW YOU CAN GET ACCESS TO THIS INFORMATION. PLEASE REVIEW IT CAREFULLY.

We have established the minimum “need to know” privacy standards and limit staff members access to your health information according to their primary job functions. Everyone on our staff is required to sign a confidentiality statement. We will keep your health information confidential and use it only for the following purposes:

Sports Medicine Operations: With your consent, we may use health information about you for treatment (such as sending your medical record information to a specialist physician as part of a referral), to obtain payment for treatment (such as sending billing information to a health insurance plan), for administrative purposes, and to evaluate the quality of care that you receive (such as comparing patient data to improve treatment methods).

We may use and disclose your health information to seek payment for services we provide to you. This disclosure involves our business office staff and may include insurance organizations or other businesses that may become involved in the process of mailing statements or collecting unpaid bills.

We may release health information concerning your medical status, medical condition, injuries, prognosis, diagnosis and treatments to an interpreter when there is a communication barrier.

We may disclose your health information to the Director of Athletics, Assistant Director of Athletics, or your coaches in order to assure your safe participation and allow coaches to make informed decisions about the athletes’ playing status in practice, games, and other team activities. Information given may include the diagnosis, prognosis, restrictions, precautions and treatment of such injury.

We may disclose your health information to your parents even if you are 18 years and older in order to keep them informed about your medical status, to assure them of your safe participation in athletics, and to assist in getting approval and payment from personal insurance provider. Information given may include the diagnosis, prognosis, restrictions, precautions, and treatment of such injury.

We may release health information concerning your medical status, medical condition, injuries, prognosis, diagnosis and treatment to physicians including the College physician and the student's primary care physician, College Health Services, midlevel practitioners, nutritionists, psychiatrists, counselors, or other professionals in order to provide a multidisciplinary approach for medical and psychological treatment.

Sports Information and the Media: We may release information concerning your medical status, medical condition, injuries, prognosis, diagnosis, and related personally identifiable health information to the media including, specifically the Elmira College Sports Information Department and to various media outlets.

Academic and Residential Concerns: We may release information concerning your medical status, medical condition, injuries, prognosis, diagnosis, and related personally identifiable health information to parents, professors, and appropriate administrators in the event of an injury which results in preventing an athlete from attending class, an injury needing monitoring, or an injury requiring a medical assessment.

Emergencies: We may use or describe your health information to notify, or assist in the notification of a family member or anyone responsible for your care, in case of any emergency, your location, your general condition, or death. If at all possible we will provide you with an opportunity to object to this use or disclosure. Under emergency conditions, a threat to your health or another person's health or safety or if you are incapacitated, we will use our professional judgment to disclose only that information directly relevant to your care.

Required by Law: Subject to certain requirements, we may give out health information without your authorization for public health purposes, abuse or neglect reporting, auditing purposes, worker's compensation purposes and emergencies. We provide information when otherwise required by law, such as court or administrative order, subpoena, discovery request or other lawful process. We will use and disclose your health information when requested by national security intelligence, and other state and federal officials and if you are an inmate or otherwise under the custody of law enforcement.

Individual Rights: In most cases, you have the right to look at or get a copy of health information about you. If you request copies, we will charge you \$0.07 for each page. You also have the right to receive a list of instances where we disclosed health information about you for reasons other than treatment, payment, or related administrative purposes. If you believe that information in your record is incorrect or if important information is missing, you have the right to request that we correct the existing information or add the missing information. You have the right to request that your health information be communicated to you in a confidential manner such as sending mail to an address other than your home.

You may request in writing that we not use or disclose your information for treatment, payment, or administrative purposes or to persons involved in your care except when specifically authorized by you, when required by law, or in emergency circumstances. We will consider your request, but are not legally required to accept it.

We may change our policies at any time. Before we make a significant change in our policies, we will change our notice and post the new notice in the waiting area and in each examination room. You can also request a copy of our notice at any time.

Complaints: If you are concerned that we have violated your privacy rights, or you disagree with a decision we made about access to your records, you may contact the person listed below. You may also send a written complaint to the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services at 26 Federal Plaza, Suite 3313, New York, New York 10278. Under no circumstance will you be retaliated against for filing a complaint.
